Energy Conservation Efforts

- Villa incandescent lighting conversion to CFL's.
- Hale Kona, Hale Moana, and Hale Naia garage lighting conversion from metal halide HID lamps to energy efficient T5 fluorescent lighting.
- LED lighting in the lobby display cases.
- Hale Kona, Hale Moana, and Hale Naia window tinting.
- Watt Stopper motion sensor installation in the villa bathrooms and back of house.
- Hale Kona and Hale Moana stairwell motion sensor installation.
- Hale Kona, Hale Moana and Hale Naia A/C occupancy sensor installation.
- Electric power tools instead of gas for landscaping maintenance.

Water Conservation

- Hale Kona and Hale Moana toilet flush valve replacement with water saving Hydro Clean valve.

Recycling

- Recycle bins located around the pool areas, guest trash rooms, associate lounges and offices.
- Recycling toner cartridges.
- Disposing of non-alkaline batteries.
- Sending spent fluorescent tubes to a mercury recycling company.

Conclusion

The KoOlina Beach Club has made a commitment to conservation and recycling, and will continue to improve their daily operations. In 2009, they recycled 5.93 tons of Aluminum, 44.46 tons of cardboard and mixed paper, 2,110 gallons of fryer oil, and 82.75 tons of green waste. The KoOlina Beach Club is also going green and is using disposable take-out products, which include: biodegradable cups, plates and utensils made from corn and sugarcane fibers.
