- Insulation on ducts and water pipes.
- ➢ Weather-stripping.
- Energy efficient light bulbs.

- Select energy efficient equipment.
- > Follow Best management practices for kitchens.

- ➢ Large hood filters.
- ➢ Rubber mats.
