A private entity is considered a small business in accordance with Small Business Administration's Small Business Size Standards. The Small Business Association guidelines for qualifying as a small business may be found at http://www.sba.gov/content/table-small-business-size-standards. Non-profit businesses are not eligible for USDA-REAP grants or loans for renewable energy systems and energy efficiency improvements.
