Reason for Approval/Permit: To conduct research and/or collect native invertebrate species on State or private lands

Permit Prerequisite(s): Documented experience with invertebrate research or collecting, and/or collaboration with individual(s) with documented experience. State permit is only valid when accompanied by a federal permit issued by U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service.

Checklist	Estimated Time
1. Applicant contacts the DOFAW Entomologist and submits Application for Research/T&E Collection/Access/Activity Permit.	
2. DOFAW Entomologist reviews application for completeness and forwards application to relevant branch managers, forest reserve managers and taxonomic specialists for feedback.	
3. DOFAW issues approval (with conditions) or denial of request.	90 days from Application Acceptance
Total Estimated Time from Application Acceptance	90 days
