4.	Chairperson issues approval (with conditions) or denial of application.	60 days after Receipt
5.	Applicant files indemnity bond, within 10 calendar days after approval, not less than \$50,000 for each well or a blanket bond of \$250,000 for any number of wells. HAR 13-183-68.	
6.	Permits shall be valid for a period of 365 calendar days from date of issuance, but may be renewed for an additional 180 calendar days at the discretion of the chairperson.
