

Construction / Alteration in Potential Airspace (FAA-1)

Proposed Construction or Alteration in Airspace Federal Aviation Agency FAA Forms 7460 - 1 & 2

Reason for Permit: Anytime a proposed project involves a structure more than 200 feet in height above ground level at its site the construction needs to be reviewed and approved by the FAA. Additional requirements exist for structures closer than 20,000 feet to the nearest point of the nearest airport runway of specified airports. Any organization planning to sponsor any construction or alterations which may affect the navigable airspace must file a Notice of Proposed Construction or Alteration (FAA Form 7460-1 either electronically via the website referenced below or manually with the FAA)

Approval Authority: Federal Aviation Agency (FAA)

- any construction or alteration exceeding 200 ft above ground level
- any construction or alteration:
 - within 20,000 ft of a public use or military airport which exceeds a 100:1 surface from any point on the runway of each airport with its longest runway more than 3,200 ft
 - within 10,000 ft of a public use or military airport which exceeds a 50:1 surface from any point on the runway of each airport with its longest runway no more than 3,200 ft
 - within 5,000 ft of a public use heliport which exceeds a 25:1 surface

1. File Form 7460-1.* See instructions for the Obstruction Evaluation (OE)/Airport Airspace Analysis (AAA) filing process at: https://oeaaa.faa.gov/oeaaa/external/portal.jsp . Form 7460-1 may be filed electronically or via U.S. Postal Mail.	30 Days
2. FAA makes determination and sends letter to applicant. The letter will state whether Form 7460-2 needs to be filed.	--
3. If Form 7460-2 is required, it may be submitted electronically or via U.S. Postal Mail at the completion of construction.	--

*The notice must be submitted at least 30 days before the earlier of the following dates:

- (1) The date the proposed construction or alteration is to begin.
- (2) The date an application for a construction permit is to be filed.
